OID19 is the Italian edition of Open Infrastructure Days 2019, formerly OpenStack Days 2-3 October Milan + Rome




#### OpenStack Foundation

#### New name!


OpenStack community has changed name in OpenInfra and this is done to span from pure Cloud (i.e. network, computing and storage as a service, or "software defined") to neighboring application scopes such as

- Container Infrastructure (with Kata Containers),
- CI/CD (with Zuul)
- Automation (with Airship)
- Edge Computing (with StarlingX).



### Ecosystem

- The list of companies supporting OpenStack is quite long and almost everyone with a relevant weight.
- The aim of these supporters is only one: cooperate for building an alternative.
- Alternative to... you guess! :-)
- How to make that is pretty clear too: through collaborative Open Source.



### Open Source

The implications of such an approach go beyond the mere choice of a language.

They rather concern and actually shape an entire ecosystem and its organisation:

- The way to work together
- The way to take decisions
- The flow of information among equal peers

are very different than what a single organisation (or vendor) could ever even think of applying via a hierarchic approach.

It is based on assumptions that are essential for veterans.

#### From consumers to citizens


It is a cultural fact, which modifies ont only the way people work (i.e. what I do), but how to take part (i.e. what I am) to the creation of a product/service.

Collaborative Open Source is a way to shift technician role from consumers to citizens.

- Edge Computing is taking cloud paradigm and spreading it all around it on a geographical scale, seeking the perfect join with 5G and new networks.
